

The Russian-speaking UMC Agape - Prague has already delivered several shipments of food, drugs and medicines to the city of Sumy in the northwestern part of Ukraine. The town, like other towns in the area, is bombed daily. In this situation, many people have gone to the west of Ukraine, to Poland and to the Czech Republic. However, some people are staying. This morning (March 16) the following message came from Sumy from Anatoly Veselov with whom Lev Shults, the pastor of the Agape congregation, is in touch:

Last night the city of Sumy was bombed again. One bomb fell next to the house of Deacon Valentine. In the explosion, a window in the room where Valentine and his wife were, flew out, passed just above their heads and hit the wall of the room. At the moment the bomb exploded, Valentine and his wife were on their knees praying. If they had been standing at that moment, they would have been dead. The house is destroyed, but our brother and sister are still alive. Praise Christ!
